The School Liaison Officer Program combines education, investigation, law enforcement, counselling, crime prevention and community relations to meet the diverse needs of the school community.

- Deliver safety and crime prevention lessons to students, staff and parents (drugs, bullying, safe driving, violence, cyber-safety, etc.)
- Counsel and talk informally with students
- Investigate criminal offenses relating to the school and its population
- Serve as liaison between the school and the criminal justice system
- Resource for community policing programs and careers in policing

SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER TEAM

Working in partnership with students, families, and community to meet the educational needs of every student. Our social worker and child youth counsellor (CYC) provide specialized counselling for students and families.

- Social, emotional and mental health issues (depression, anxiety, self-harm, eating disorders)
- Relationships (peers, friends, parents)
- Barriers to regular attendance
- Personal issues/concerns (bullying, racism, sexism, heterosexism, transphobia)
- Adapting to change (new school, transition to high school, family dynamics)
- Liaise with community agencies and resources

Counselling staff assist students in developing competencies such as confidence building, problem solving, managing change and accountability.

Referrals – by student, parent

Students 14 and over can access social worker without parent consent

Support students with unique learning needs to thrive and gain full benefit from the school experience.

- Specialized programming (LEAP, Essential)
- Support students with goal setting, self-advocacy, learning skills
- Meet with teachers to ensure students have required accommodations and resources
- Update/manage/review all IEPs
- Assist students with academic programming/course planning/post-secondary planning
- Special educ. testing
- Transition of students with special needs to pre/post secondary educ.
